

4-H Council Minutes March 14, 2007

Council President Bruce Neumann called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Vicki Johnson, Nancy Metcalfe, and Janna Kincheloe were present at the meeting.

Pledges were recited. Minutes from the last meeting (1/17/07) were approved as read by Janna.

The treasurer's report was given. There is \$835.16 in checking, \$9135.66 in passbook savings, \$3611.51 in trip fund savings, and \$3418.80 in CD's.

Old Business:

The Winter Livestock Judging was held in Hobson at Stevenson's old sale barn on Sunday, March 11th. Dusty Reisig of Lewistown presented a reasons/EPD's clinic prior to the judging. Approximately 30 4-H and FFA members attended the judging.

Quality Assurance training was held Tuesday, March 13th at the City Hall in Stanford. Junior leaders helping present hand-on workshops included: Carley Stone, Kirstie McDonald, Beth Vincent, Katie Vincent, Dawnita Deichmann, Quinn Johnson, Frank Fiedler, Garth Fiedler, and Jeff Sampsel.

Janna gave an update on the pavilion. Plans are progressing and the pavilion should be finished by Fair time.

The Fair Board and Stampede Club have agreed to partially enclose the livestock pavilion to keep the wind to a minimum during the QuickDraw at the Stanford Stampede. This should not affect the livestock shows at the Fair.

New Business:

Demonstration Day will be held Friday, April 20th at Stanford School.

The hog weigh-in day was scheduled for Saturday, April 28th. Janna will check with Heather to make sure the new small animal scale is ready to go. The Extension Office will arrange a lamb weigh-in date. Janna needs to check with Jackie Urick to determine the date of her lamb sale.
