Proxy Buyer Agreement

Proxy Buyers:

There have been questions raised about proxy bidding, a practice used in most every sale in the state. It is important to be clear about the proxy bidding procedure so all involved understand their role and responsibilities.

Recommendations for proxy bidding for 4-H livestock sales:

No one should engage in proxy bidding without a proxy bid form in hand from the bidder for whom person is the proxy.

The proxy bid form must have the bidder's signature and date as well as the animal desired, the top price the bidder will pay and the destination of the animal.

The proxy bid forms should be retained in the Teton County Extension office for at least four months following the sale.
