

Explore New Territories with 4-H!

July 19-21, 2011

Hitch up your wagons and get set to Explore New Territories at Teton County 4-H Camp. There will be a round-up on Tuesday, July 19 at 12:30 p.m. The cooking fires won't be lit until 6:00 p.m., so please fill up on grub before heading out. Remember, explorers should pack lightly, but have everything they need.

Bedding

- Sleeping bag/sheets and blankets (It can be very cool in the evenings.)
- Pillow

Toiletries

- Soap/Shampoo
- Toothpaste/brush
- Comb/brush
- Towels/wash cloth
- Cosmetics (If needed!)

Clothing

- Clothes for two nights and three days
- Extra shoes and socks (as they can get wet)
- Shorts/t-shirt/water shoes for water fight (no swimsuits)
- Plastic bag for wet clothing
- Clothing for a variety of weather and paint clothes
- Jacket for chilly mornings and evenings
- Pajamas

Personal Items

- Calling card (There is limited cell service or calling opportunity)
- Sports or game equipment (you are responsible for it)
- Camera (If you want to share your photos, we can download them at camp.)
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Flashlights
- Alarm clock
- Buckets/recycled containers to be used during water fight (water weapons get clogged). We do not allow personal electronic devices to be used during camp (Campers should leave iPods, Gameboys, etc. at home and be prepared to be fully engaged in activities at camp.)

Directions

- Please arrive at Camp Rotary by 12:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 19, 2011. **Please eat lunch before your arrival.** Your first meal at camp will be at 6:00 p.m. A list of other campers has been included so you can carpool. The adventure will end on Thursday, July 21 at 12:30 p.m. Adults who are wrangling up 4-H members need to check with Jane Wolery before leaving. Camp Counselors should plan to stay a little bit later for final cleaning of the camp ground.
- To get to camp, go east out of Great Falls, turn right at the rest stop east of Belt, and drive beyond Monarch and beyond the Lazy Doe Bar. The turn to Camp Rotary is after a big white barn. There is a brown sign that says "Camp Rotary," but it is small. The turn is on the right hand side. Cross a bridge immediately after the turn and take the mile-long (very bumpy) trail to camp. It should take around two hours travel time.

Contact Information

- There is a payphone in the lodge at Camp Rotary. Someone is usually near the lodge to hear the phone ring. Many cell phones do not have service at camp. If you need to contact us during camp, please call 236-9945.
- The caretaker is Wayne Cartwright, 4703 US Hwy 89 South, Monarch, MT 59463, 406-236-5938. You may call him ONLY in an emergency situation after trying to reach us at the lodge phone number.

Rules

- Treat all others with respect and politeness. Use appropriate and pleasant language.
- Be responsible for your own items and attitude.
- Fireworks, firearms, illegal drugs, tobacco and intoxicants are not permitted.
- Stay in the camp boundaries and away from any construction on the premises.
- Respect facilities and natural surroundings.
- Stay out of the kitchen area unless invited by a cook.
- Wear your name tag at all times.
- Ask permission to enter a boys'/girls' cabin. Door must be left open when boys and girls are in same cabin.
- Attend all functions at camp.
- There will be no unscheduled water fights. Those engaging in water fights without permission from camp director will be given additional cleaning duties.
- Remember to use your manner words – please, thank you, you're welcome, sorry.
- Hats will be removed during meals, grace and flag ceremonies.
- Dress Code: Please wear shorts that are below your extended fingertips. No swimsuits will be worn at camp, even during water fights. Tank tops may be worn, but must have one-inch strap. No belly buttons or undergarments should be showing. Your modest and appropriate dress is appreciated.
- Think of safety in all activities.
