

LARGE ANIMAL SHOWMANSHIP

To be held before the judging of each class of the following animals: Beef, Dairy, Horse, Sheep, Swine & Goat. Showmanship Awards will be presented immediately after each event. (Senior, Junior, Pre-junior).

RULES:

1. 4-H members must be exhibiting in the class division in which they participate.
2. Showmanship contest will be held before the judging of each class of animals.
3. Showmanship entries must be included on the 4-H's entry blank. Please double check your entries.
4. Exhibitors must have entered the animal shown in showmanship in one of the following classes of livestock - Beef, Dairy, Horse, Sheep, Swine and/or Goat.
5. Refer to Overall Livestock Rules for dress code.
6. All animals in each of the classes must be trained to be handled by the exhibitor.
7. Must show evidence of training and fitting.
8. Beef animals handled by halter and show stick.
9. Horses handled by halter by MT Quarter horse rules.
10. Dairy handled by halter.
11. Swine handled by cane.
12. Goats are to be shown by collar or small link chain.
13. Sheep are held at the throat under the jaw.
14. 4-H'ers must show only their own animals, but may enter more than one lot if they are enrolled in more than one livestock project.
15. Each lot of livestock winners will be awarded a ribbon and premium money in lots 1 - 6 inclusive.
16. Top Showman in lots 1 - 6 will be awarded a belt buckle. Reserve Showman will be awarded a plaque provided they are blue ribbon showman. Only blue ribbon advance to Round Robin.
17. Round Robin for Senior, Junior and Pre-Junior winners will be held in the grassed show ring, refer to 4-H fair schedule for time. Senior Division will be the first to show followed by the Junior and Pre-Junior Division.
18. Each Senior and Junior Round Robin contestant will be required to show a beef, dairy, horse or pony, sheep, swine and goat or each animal in the show arena.
19. Each Pre-Junior Division contestant will be required to show a horse, sheep, swine and goat or each animal in the show arena.
20. Round Robin: If a 4-H'er wins in more than one lot of Class 48 & 49, he or she must choose which lot (animal) he or she wants to show in the Round Robin. The second place blue ribbon showman of the unchosen lot/lots will then be moved up to show his or her own animal in the Round Robin. All contestants will start with "0" points.
21. Round Robin Showmanship contestants who have won in more than one lot (animal) must decide which animal they will enter the ring with. (Second place winners will be moved up to fill the 1st place winner.) They must notify the department superintendents of the animal they have chosen to show. Notification must be made to the superintendent no later than 8:00 pm on the day of the live animal placings.
22. Each Round Robin contestant will be showing a beef, dairy, horse, sheep, swine or goat in the show ring. (If the top showman of a lot/lots of Class 48 or 49 chooses not to show in the Round Robin, he or she will keep the buckle/buckles won, the second place showman, etc., provided they are blue ribbon showman, will then show his/her own animal in the Round Robin Livestock Showmanship).
